This past month has been very exciting. We have had more responses from listeners than at any other time. We attribute this to the increase of our listener base due to the recent upgrade of our transmitter from the 250w to a 2-kilo watt. Every new day comes with new challenges that the Lord has enabled us overcome by faith. This alone has motivated us to



redouble our efforts in serving Christ, knowing too well, what our reward will be when the end time comes and we are re-united in the air with our living Lord.

About two weeks ago, a lady called our studios with a prayer request for the healing of her son. She was calling from the hospital where the son had been hospitalized diagnosed with malaria and was unable to speak, nor walk. The next day 18 hours later, she called again to give thanks to God for a miracle! The son had miraculously woken up the next day strong, talking and able to walk on his own. Praise the Lord brethren for demonstrating to us that those things we think are impossible are possible if we trust and call upon His name.

When I heard of this testimony, I got touched in the spirit and I promised the Lord that I would go and visit those ailing in the hospitals to give them hope by sharing God's word and the love of Jesus Christ with them. When I talked to the hospital administrators if I could visit the patients to share and give the radios to them, they were very positive and willing to give us an opportunity. This culminated in our touring the two big hospitals in Kitale town; namely Mt. Elgon and District Hospital to give each ward a radio that they may listen to the gospel twenty-four hours and share in the blessings. Praise God!

I was astonished that nearly every patient we interviewed was a listener of Imani radio. The nurses and doctors too were Imani listeners and they requested to be given a radio each. It is only when you go out there and talk to people, then you realize the souls that are being reached through radio media.

We are planning to take the road to one of the indigenous tribal villages of West Pokot (*see picture next page*) next month to share the good news and donate radios to these people who can neither afford a radio nor even buy batteries. The solar powered radios will be a big outreach ministry that will reach the pastoralist community of West Pokot.
